

Advocating passionately for Indigenous affairs, youth empowerment, mental health, and environmental conservation, Tremane is from the Ngarinyin and Walmajarri tribes in the Kimberley.

Beyond school, Tremane actively engages in community initiatives and served as the Youth member for Kimberley in 2022 through YMCA Youth Parliament, where subsequently he was appointed as a youth member for the organisation. Recognised nationally for his advocacy, he currently advises the Australian Government on Indigenous education engagement as a Youth Advisor for the Australian Government First Nations Education Youth Advisory Group.

Tremane's dedication to a more equitable future inspires young leaders in his community, state-wide & nationally, epitomising resilience and positive change.


